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### **RESPONSE TO AN OFFICIAL INFORMATION ACT REQUEST (REF: DOIA015-2024/25)**

On 12 September 2024, you contacted the Ministry for Pacific Peoples (the Ministry) requesting under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), information regarding all documents relating to Budget 2024. I have outlined your specific request and my response below.

Can I please request all documents relating to Budget 2024, including all proposed bids that did not make it into the final budget.

I have identified 3 documents that are within the scope of your request and are appended to this letter (refer to **Appendix 1**). Please note that some information has been withheld under:

- section 9(2)(a) of the OIA to protect the privacy of natural persons and •
- section 9(2)(f)(iv) of the OIA to protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers • of the Crown and officials.

I am satisfied that there are no other public interest considerations that render it desirable to make the information withheld under section 9 of the OIA available.

#### Purpose

1. This briefing seeks your approval of the Ministerial Submission letter to Minister of Finance, Hon Nicola Willis, confirming the submission of the Initial Baseline Exercise Summary for the Ministry for Pacific Peoples.

#### Background

 On 11 December 2023, Cabinet agreed to a Fiscal Sustainability programme. This phase of the programme, the Initial Baseline Exercise, forms the basis of Budget 2024. It aims to provide an oversight of the activities and expenditures of each Vote and for agencies to submit proposals aligned to the Government's priorities.

#### Savings through baseline reduction

3. The Ministry's savings proposal aligns with the Government's priority of 'delivering effective and fiscally sustainable public services'. The Ministry plans to achieve this by reducing backoffice FTE, through the rationalising and clustering of functions. There will be subsequent reduction to overhead costs relating to a reduced workforce.



## Section 3: Planning for Managing Within Baselines

The Ministry has started a Change Process that will run between 1 February 2024 to 30 June 2024, with a 1 July 2024 go-live.

The outcome is a reduction to FTE and subsequent efficiencies from a reduced workforce, such as office space, equipment, software, flights, accommodation, etc.

The annual baseline savings target of 59(2)(f)(iv) will be realised by 30 June 2025.

There will be redundancy costs associated with this initiative however these costs are expected to be covered from 2023/24 budget.

There are risk we have considered:

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- Pacific communities' concern of the Ministry's ability to engage with them and of the Ministry's future as an entity being uncertain.
- A reduction to the Ministry's workforce can have an initial impact on the delivery of the Ministry's work programmes,

However, through Stakeholder engagement and reprioritisation of work programmes to ensure the coalition Government priorities are delivered on, the Ministry expects these to be Low Risk with little long-term impact.

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
